Whereas Chesapeake College and Salisbury University are committed to expanding educational opportunities, and

Whereas the two institutions are committed to providing a smooth transition for students wishing to earn an associate's degree and a baccalaureate degree, and

Whereas the intent of the institutions is to avoid duplication of curricula where appropriate within articulated programs of study, and

Whereas the institutions better serve the educational growth of students and the economic development of the community through cooperative educational planning and optimal utilization of community resources,

BE IT HEREWITH RESOLVED that this agreement commits the partners to full support of an articulation process to deliver and Associate-Baccalaureate Program in Interdisciplinary Studies, Individually Designed Track.

PROVISIONS OF THE AGREEMENT

1. This program articulation agreement applies to Chesapeake College's Associate of Arts Degree in Liberal Arts and Sciences and Salisbury University's Bachelor of Arts Degree Program in Interdisciplinary Studies, Individually Designed Track
2. The institutions agree to follow the joint program curriculum and course by course articulation delineated in this document.
3. Both educational institutions will cooperate toward developing, disseminating, and presenting the articulated program information to students.
4. Graduates of the Chesapeake College program who have completed the associate's degree program in Liberal Arts and Sciences with a cumulative grade point average of 2.0 or higher will automatically be granted admission to Salisbury University as an Interdisciplinary Studies major.
5. All articulated course credits earned with a C or better will be accepted for transfer according to the program matrix.
6. Students intending to transfer should apply for admission by the priority deadline for the semester for which they intend to enroll.
7. Students are subject to all the policies and procedures of all institutions.
8. Students are subject to all specific policies pertaining to students admitted to the Baccalaureate Degree Program in Interdisciplinary Studies.
9. This articulation agreement is based on the present curricula contained in this document, and it is effective for a five year period from 2017 to 2022.
10. Either institution may at any time indicate changes to this articulation agreement. Both institutions reserve the right to modify the programs as deemed necessary and agree to inform the appropriate individuals of said changes.

- Students must apply online for graduation by November 15 for May and by May 15 for December.

MAJOR REQUIREMENTS

Salisbury University offers a major in interdisciplinary studies (IDIS) leading to the Bachelor of Arts or Bachelor of Science. The major accommodates students who wish to develop programs of study in two or more disciplines or create a major in an area of study not offered by any traditional major at SU.

- Submit an IDIS Proposal Form to the interdisciplinary studies coordinator for approval in order to officially change to the interdisciplinary studies major.
- Program proposal must include a goal statement that shows a rationale for the cohesion of the areas of study and describe any potential career goals suitable for the program proposal.
- Program proposals should list any lower-division prerequisites to the courses chosen for the IDIS major and note the possible 300-/400-level courses being used to complete the IDIS major.
- Complete a minimum of 30 semester hours in 300-/400-level courses from 2 or 3 approved academic disciplines with grades of C or better, including IDIS 335 and IDIS 435, with a grade of C or better as part of their approved program.
- Completing all prerequisite courses required for the courses chosen for their IDIS major and list the course prerequisites on the program proposal.
- Upper-division courses (300/400 level) completed prior to receiving program approval may or may not be used for the IDIS major, and no more than 18 such credits may be credited toward the major.
- At least 15 credits must be taken in residence at SU.
- No more than 2 of the courses used to meet the IDIS major may be used to meet minor or other major requirements.
- For those seeking a B.A., demonstrate 102-level proficiency in a foreign language.
- Any deviation from an approved program must be approved in writing by the IDIS coordinator.
