## MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

## **PURPOSE OF AGREEMENT**

Harford Community College and Salisbury University are committed to expanding educational opportunities. The two institutions are committed to providing a smooth transition for students wishing to earn an associate of arts degree and a baccalaureate of arts degree. The intent of the two institutions is to avoid duplication of curricula where appropriate within articulated programs of studies and better serve the educational growth of students and the economic development of the community through cooperative educational planning and optimal utilization of community resources. This agreement commits the partners to full support of an articulation process between similar academic programs offered by the two institutions.

## **AGREEMENT**

Harford Community College in Bel Air, Maryland, and Salisbury University in Salisbury, Maryland agree to follow the joint program curriculum and course-by-course articulation delineated in this document, for completion of requirements for the *Bachelor of Arts* degree in *Communication Arts – Media Production Track* (Attachment A), which is attached to, and incorporated by reference into, this Memorandum of Understanding (MOU). Both educational institutions will cooperate toward developing, disseminating, and presenting the articulated program information to students. The following principles guide the operation of this MOU, with the requirements for transfer in specific curricula set forth in Attachment A.

- 1. Salisbury University will accept a maximum number of 60 credits from Harford Community College as outlined in the Attachment A. The number of transferable credits specific to this program is reflected in Attachment A.
- 2. Graduates of the Harford Community College program who have completed the *Associate of Applied Science Degree* Mass Communications Production and Announcing in the Electronic Media Track with a cumulative grade point average of 2.0 or higher will automatically be granted admission to Salisbury University as a Communication Arts major.
- 3. All articulated course credits earned with a "C" or better will be accepted for transfer according to the program matrix.
- 4. In accordance with Code of Maryland Regulation, all courses meeting general education requirements at Harford Community College, or a suitable substitute offered as part of the associate degree, will transfer to Salisbury University as general education. Other

- 5. Students intending to transfer should complete the admissions application for Salisbury University following the third semester of their associate degree program.
- 6. Students are subject to all policies and procedures of both institutions, as well as all specific policies pertaining to students admitted to the Bachelor of Arts Degree Program in Communication Arts.
- 7. Harford Community College students transferring to Salisbury University will be given every consideration for financial aid and will be eligible to compete for academic scholarships upon entrance to Salisbury University subject to stated scholarship deadlines.
- 8. Both Harford Community College and Salisbury University agree to work together to facilitate the transfer of students from Harford Community College to Salisbury University and to work cooperatively to ensure the high quality of the programs at the respective institutions. Transfer of students will be in accordance with policies and procedures of both institutions, as they may be amended from time to time.
- 9. This MOU is based on the present curricula contained in this document and will be in effect for a five-year period, beginning in *Spring 2018* and concluding at the end of *Fall 2023*.
- 10. Both institutions, at any time, may initiate changes to this articulation. Any modifications the parties deem necessary must be evidenced in writing and signed by the authorized officials of each institution. The MOU may be terminated by either party for due cause and after adequate notice of not less than six months is given to the other party.
- 11. Salisbury University will establish procedures to provide information on the academic progress of Harford Community College students enrolled as part of this MOU.
- 12. Attachment A presents all required courses a student must take at both Harford Community College and Salisbury University to complete a BA in Communication Arts at Salisbury University. Furthermore, Attachment A delineates all course equivalents. Attachment A also provides a recommended sequence of courses along with advising notes, but it is understood by both institutions that a student may not be able to follow the exact sequence laid out by Attachment A; therefore, students are strongly encouraged to meet with academic advisors to ensure that all requirements for completion of the associate's degree, transfer to the University, and bachelor's degree are satisfied.
- 13. As a supplementary item, see Attachment B for an academic checklist for the BA in Communication Arts at Salisbury University.
- 14. This MOU, when signed, constitutes the entire agreement between the parties and supersedes all prior agreements and understandings between the parties respecting the matter hereof.
